

Fleur du Soleil Cape Peninsula (Cape Point, Penguin Beach, Chapmans Peak, Hout Bay)

Private Day Tour: Approximately 9 hours – R2,995 per person



This tour takes you on a luxurious journey through the Cape's most beautiful and breathtaking scenery as you absorb the whole Peninsula, from East to West, North to South, covering what is known to be one of the "World's Best Scenic Drives", to the most Southwestern tip of Africa: "Cape Point and The Cape of Good Hope". Not to mention the incredibly cute and adorable African Penguins at Boulders Beach. You will stop at iconic

photographic locations, gaining an understanding why this is known as "the Fairest Cape of them All".

Highlights Include:

- St James Beach, Muizenberg for its colourful houses on the beach (picture spot)
- Jubilee Square & Jetty, Simon's Town
- Boulders Beach (view the African penguins in their natural habitat)
- Cape Point and Cape of Good Hope (and the iconic lighthouse viewpoint)
- Chapman's Peak Drive (one of the world's most breathtaking drives)
- Hout Bay Harbour and Mariner's Wharf for late lunch
- Pass through many picturesque villages and Table Mountain National Park



Included:

- Transport to and from the Cape Peninsula in a Private Luxury Vehicle (no other occupants)
- Toll Fees at Chapman's Peak

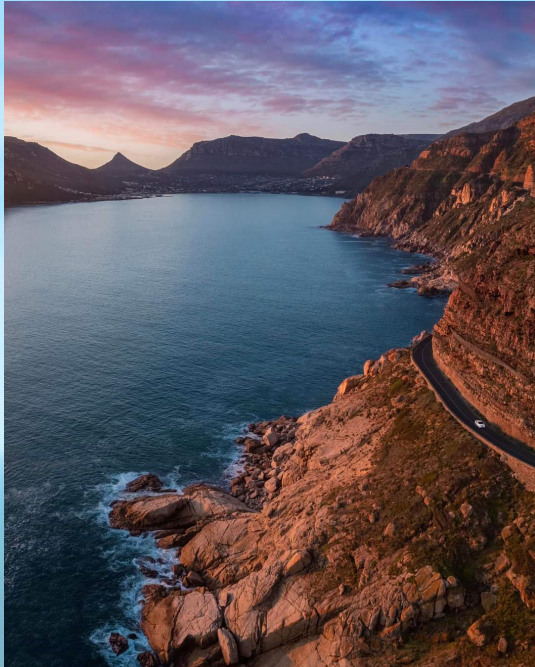
- Payable in full to confirm and cancelable up to 14 days prior to the day of tour.

Itinerary:

- 08h30 - Depart Fleur du Soleil Luxury Guesthouse
- St James Beach Stop: 10 minutes. Indulge in the beautiful passing vines as you travel via Helshoogte pass through the Banhoek Valley with Table Mountain in the distance as you descend towards Stellenbosch. The scenery changes with False Bay on your left, stopping at Muizenberg for a quick photo. Muizenberg is famous for its rows of brightly coloured Victorian beach changing huts and the sleepy town is still lined with the mansions of its Victorian glory days past.



- 10:30 - Jubilee Square & Jetty, Simon's Town: 15 minutes. Passing picturesque seaside towns like Kalk Bay and Fish Hoek you arrive in Simon's Town with its scenic square offering water views, restaurants & shops, plus a crafts market & monuments. It is also a navy base.



- 10:35 - Boulders Beach Penguin Colony: 1 hour stop. Boulders Beach is a sheltered beach made up of inlets between granite boulders, from which the name originated. It is popular due to the colony of African penguins which settled there in 1982. These African penguins are only found on the coastlines of Southern Africa - (South Africa & Namibia). One of the only places in the world where you can swim alongside penguins. Admission Ticket Not Included. (Appr. R152 per adult)

- 11:30 - Old Cape Point Lighthouse Next to Cape Point: 1 hour stop. You will have a choice between a 15-minute hike or taking the Flying Dutchman Funicular to the Cape Point Lighthouse. Funicular Ticket Not Included. (R100 Return fee)

- 12:30 - Cape of Good Hope: 1 hour stop. The Cape of Good Hope is at the Southern tip of the Cape Peninsula and is the most Southwestern point of Africa. It was originally named the Cape of Storms by Portuguese explorer Bartholomew Dias in 1488. It was later renamed, by King John II of Portugal, the Cape of Good Hope

because of the great optimism engendered by the opening of a sea route to India and the East. With its diverse habitat, ranging from rocky mountain tops to beaches and open sea, the Cape of Good Hope is home to at least 250 species of birds including one of the two mainland colonies of African penguins, baboon and rare antelope called Bontebok. Admission Ticket Not Included. (Appr. R400 per adult Entrance fee)

- 13:30 – 14:30: 1 hour drive. Chapman's Peak Drive: Between Noordhoek and Hout Bay on the Atlantic Coast is one of the most spectacular marine drives in the world. With sheer drops to the sea below and towering mountains rising above you, the twists and curves in the road seem endless and it is a photographer's dream. Hardly a month goes by without an international film crew or TV commercial being hosted here.

- 14:30: Hout Bay and Mariner's Wharf for late lunch: 1.5 hours. Hout Bay is the base port to rich marine life and offers some of the finest yellowfin tuna, longfin tuna, and yellowtail fishing in the world along with a huge variety of pelagic sea birds with many different species have been sighted at different times of the year. Mariner's Wharf is a great restaurant for daily caught fish. There are fresh fish outlets and craft stores, with views of the bay. The Hout Bay Harbour market offers handmade arts and crafts, and a range of foods is available.



- 16h00: Depart for Fleur du Soleil: Drive via Constantia Neck past Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, University of Cape Town, and the Rhodes Memorial.
- 18:00: Arrive back at Fleur du Soleil Luxury Guesthouse
